SENATOR CARPENTER: No I'd, Yes. Is it your understanding Senator, it's mine after listening to Senator Snyder, that this body is afraid of over exposure? And I don't blame you.

SPEAKER: Senator Proud do you care to respond?

SENATOR PROUD: I don't think it requires a response.

SPEAKER: Very good, motion is, you've heard the motion that relates to ETV, decreasing the coverage all those in favor of the motion vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The Chair would also rule
