SPEAKER: The chair would also rule and perhaps the chair should earlier this morning have ruled also and told you that in order for you to bind this body it takes 25 votes. It would seem to me on this particular issue that you are binding the body to a commitment here and the chair would then rule that this motion requires 25 votes. Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: I would like to call of the house.

SPEAKER: Senator Proud has asked for a call of the house. Does the chair see five hands? Thank you. The clerk will clear the board. On the next vote, please indicate your presence. We are under call of the house. Senator Proud.

SPEAKER: Have the clerk read the motion.

CLERK: The motion says--

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter, I don't see any problem with re-reading the motion here which is on the desk and a matter of record.

SENATOR PROUD: Read the motion, period.

SPEAKER: Pardon me.

SENATOR PROUD: Read the motion, period. It speaks for itself.

SPEAKER: Very good, the clerk will read the motion.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: Another call of the house. Senator Goodrich, for what purpose do you rise?
