CLERK: The motion is as follows: Read.

SPEAKER: In the opinion of the chair, you are asking for a binding of the body in this particular question, therefore, the chair would require 25 votes. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Voting on Senator Syas's motion. Have you all voted? The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The motion carried. Are there other motions on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one new bill.

That is all I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Barnett. For what purpose do you rise, Senator?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I wonder if Senator Whitney would yield to a question.

SPEAKER: I am sorry, I didn't--
