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pot Senator Savage is this, that an additional pool of staff members be hired and assigned to the legislative council and then from this pool those new members or anybody else as far as that's concerned who desire help could then draw from that pool. Those who don't want to draw from the pool would be free to have nothing to do with the new staff members and they have another arrangement themselves. But for those who desire additional help I think we should encourage them in their research, I think we should add a pool, so that then they can draw from this pool and that would be my suggestion, and I support their request.

SPEAKER: Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: In response to Senator Marvel, that was one of the provisions made in our report that up to nine additional personnel should be made available for assignment, but I would like to respond to Senator Barnett's remark about my irresponsible statement. I was merely making a report and answering a question of what the maximum amount this would cost and at \$3.00 an hour, for 8 hours a day, for 49 senators it's a matter of simple arithmetic, it would cost \$1,076.00. So I don't consider that irresponsible it could cost less, but I was merely answering a Senator's request and not trying to be irresponsible.

SPEAKER: Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I think there are two basic principles that those of us who have been requesting additional staff are hoping to establish, out of our efforts. Principle number one, is simply to get a chance to have some kind of an individual personal relationship with a research (inaudible). We are not asking for somebody full time, we are simply asking for somebody part time, somebody to help us out, somebody to extend our own time. The second principle that we want to establish is the principle of flexibility. Some of you have said that you don't additional research assistance, some of you have said you don't need additional staff, you feel that you couldn't use it. I do feel that I can use it and many of the others here have said that we can use it, and I hope that we can establish a principle of flexibility so that those of us who want and need staff can use it and those who don't need, don't feel that you can use it, don't have to use it.

SPEAKER: The Chair would observe that after and if we pass Senator Simpson's motion, this will probably all come down to Executive Board and I assume the Executive Board will handle it, and then if the legislature doesn't like what the Executive Board does, they can overrule it. Mr. Clerk - is there anybody else who wants to be recognized before I have this question read. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members. I think probably we should start looking at our constituents for some advise. The general public, I think in my visiting around my district, most of them think, in fact I think we are, we are over governed, we're over regulated, we're over licensed, we pass, we introduce too many bills, we all know that, we should pass less bills, we shouldn't over 200 bills a year here, or maybe 300, there isn't that much wrong with the state, and I say that we should have the philosophy if in doubt don't, and it would be much better, I, my predecessors who was a very prominent man in the State of Nebraska, said outside of passing the budget, maybe we would better some years if we never, didn't meet at all. The people would be much happier. So I would say about the impact on our constituents I go to pay my taxes in the different counties and the county clerk or the county treasurer always says now don't pass any more bills I have to hire more help. We're getting over loaded with all the regulations that's being passed in the legislature that we have to hire extra help and increase the fiscal impact of our offices. In fact it's almost getting unbearable.
