SENATOR HASEBROOCK: I move that the bill be advanced to E&R initial.

SPEAKER: The motion has been made to advance the bill, are you ready for the question?

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk -

CLERK: Roll called. 31 Ayes Mr. President on the motion to advance, no ayes, 18 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced, Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. Speaker and members of the legislature, in the absence of the Chairman of the Revenue Committee and the absence of the Vice-Chairman of the Revenue Committee, I would ask that unanimous consent be given to cancel a hearing for LB 114 Monday to be reset for Tuesday, January 30.

SPEAKER: Have you all heard the request, this is just to change a hearing date, Mr. Clerk I think technically that calls for a suspension of the rules, does it not, however, due to the fact that the machine is broken down, we would have to take a roll call vote, and unless somebody objects this is merely a resetting of a hearing date, is that right Senator Carsten? That's all it is, unless somebody objects, I'm going to rule that unanimous consent in this emergency situation is all that is required. Are there any objections on this? There are no objections, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 10 is Senator Stahmer's bill.

SPEAKER: Senator Stahmer is absent. At this time, at 11:00 a.m. which is a matter of a few minutes, the Governor is to appear before us with his message and I'm now going to appoint a committee to escort the Governor to the Chamber, that committee will be composed of Senators Keyes, Skarda, Kelly, Rasmussen, and Johnson. Will you please repair to the Governor's office and escort him to the Chamber and, the Clerk has a message.

I referred her to Coach Devaney and if he can not resolve it through negotiations, I'm going to reveal the names of the landlords and I'm going to find out why these things occur in Lincoln, and see if the legislature is willing to see that people get consideration after the football season is over.
