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SENATOR STAHLER: If I could, let me suggest this. Are you talking also about community colleges--

SENATOR SKARDA: The whole bit--the whole batch.

SENATOR STAHLER: --and our voc tech schools and or the University and state colleges.

SENATOR SKARDA: Let's consider them altogether.

SENATOR STAHLER: State colleges and universities and the state aid and--

SENATOR SKARDA: That's correct.

SENATOR STAHLER: --this bill. I'm not opposed to that. In what sequence, then, would they be heard?

SENATOR SKARDA: We will take them as they come. It don't make any difference to me.

SENATOR STAHLER: Take them as they come. It appears LB 10 would be the first one taken when we take them altogether.

SENATOR SKARDA: That's correct.

SENATOR STAHLER: I have no opposition to that whatsoever. I think it is very reasonable.

SPEAKER: Senator Skarda, before you make some concluding remarks, Senator Moylan has asked to be recognized. Would you allow him the floor, please? Senator Moylan.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I voted in favor of this bill the other day. I suppose it is not politically expedient. However, the four mill levy that they are allowed was placed, I believe, a good many years ago on the district and naturally in every business, this inflation has washed it out like nobody's business, and I thought it a business proposition to give a little more leeway to the school board in this area because we do need new buildings in a good many areas. However, there was a statement made which I don't know whether it was clarified or not, I believe Senator Kelly made it, that this is permissive for the people of Omaha, it is permissive legislation for the school board of Omaha mostly. I wanted to clear that up a little. It is not really for the people of Omaha, it's permissive legislation for the school board to act on. So as far as following up this bill, I'm glad to see it bracketed and held until the state aid bills come through because that will be an item in this situation. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Skarda, we are back to you.

SENATOR SKARDA: May I ask Senator Moylan a question.

SPEAKER: Senator Moylan will you yield to a question.

SENATOR SKARDA: Was the sales tax a permissive piece of legislation we give the city of Omaha?

SENATOR MOYLAN: Yes, I think it was.

SENATOR SKARDA: Did they use it all?

SENATOR MOYLAN: What was that?

SENATOR SKARDA: Did they use it all?

SENATOR MOYLAN: As far as I know

SENATOR SKARDA: Thank you.
