SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Well I just wondered what happened to my motion, 10:00 on until 10:00 tomorrow?

SPEAKER: That's a good question Senator.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Yeah, I thought that carried.

SPEAKER: Do we have a motion from Senator Hasebroock to adjourn until 10:00 tomorrow. Alright. The question is - pardon me - what other motion do we have on the desk, we have one from Senator Richendifer until 9:00 tomorrow is that correct and that has now been amended to 10:00, Senator Hasebroock's motion was to amend Senator Richendifer's motion to 10:00 tomorrow, okay. We now have a motion before us to adjourn until 10:00 tomorrow as amended by, excuse me, the motion is to adjourn, we are to amend Senator Richendifer's motion by Senator Hasebroock to adjourn until 10:00 tomorrow, all those in favor of that amendment vote aye, all those opposed vote no, and the chair would add that I would expect 25 votes in this motion to bind the body to the time of adjournment even though it is a simple amendment. Senator Waldron for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WALDRON: What is the issue before the house?

SPEAKER: The issue before the house is Senator Hasebroock's amendment of the time to adjourn which is Senator Richendifer's motion to adjourn tomorrow till 9:00. He has moved thus, Senator Hasebroock has moved to amend that to 10:00, that is the motion before us at this time, as the chair understands it. Yes sir. Now once again the Chair would ask if you have all voted. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 20 nays, 12 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: We now have before us the motion to adjourn until 9:00 tomorrow, Senator Simpson for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President I ask unanimous consent to be excused tomorrow.

SPEAKER: That's a dangerous request at this time. Are there objections to Senator Simpson's, are there objections to Senator Simpson's absence tomorrow. Getting none, so ordered. Senator Stromer for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR STROMER: Okay, we will try this again since we had 23 votes in the first time. I know amend the motion, Senator Richendifer's motion which was not amended, correct, it is still at 9:00, so I amend that to strike Friday and insert Monday.

SPEAKER: Alright, Senator Waldron for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WALDRON (can't hear)

SPEAKER: Well of course it is, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President I believe the order here is that the rule would say that the motion to adjourn to a time certainly will take precedence over any other motion, so this is merely an amendment to a motion and this amendment, although the vote was on the board, the vote was not announced. So consequently this is not, this is, his motion was never taken care of, so I think he has the right to make the motion to adjourn to a time certain.

SPEAKER: The Chair will so rule that we will now vote on Senator Stromer's amendment to the motion to adjourn until 9:00 as offered by Senator Richendifer's motion, the motion now is as the Chair understands it to adjourn until 9:00, this is a motion to amend Senator Richendifer's motion to adjourn to 9:00 Monday morning, all those in favor of that motion vote aye, all those opposed vote no.
