SENATOR NORE: I'd like to have a personal privilege to ask Senator Rasmussen a question?

SPEAKER: Senator Rasmussen will you yield to another question, here from Senator Nore?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR NORE: How many vacancies do we have now in the homes?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: As of now, we have 441 patients and the last legislature gave the home at Grand Island a building at Norfolk so at the end of 74 there will be room for 630 patients.

SENATOR NORE: Is there any possibility that probably by opening this up we may, the veteran himself may have difficulty in getting in because of too many widows and mothers in the homes?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I don't think so Senator Nore, at least not according to the Veterans Organizations.

SPEAKER: What was the tally on the -

CLERK: 29 ayes, no nays, 20 not voting.

SPEAKER: Thank you, LB 33 is advanced from general file to E&R initial.

CLERK: Mr. President, Notice of Committee Hearing (read). That's all Mr. President, I have a motion.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Speaker Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: If there is no further business I move that we adjourn until 10:00 a.m. tomorrow morning.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR SYAS: Well we will let it adjourn, I just was going to call attention to if I may before this goes in operation, I brought this up last session, without being critical of anybody, anybody, I wish that when the committee reports of Chairmen that they put down who opposed who by name, who was for and against the bill. It is certainly a help on, to me and I think the rest of us of, of deciding just say that there's three were for it and two against doesn't tell us anything. I always put down who they are and it is very helpful in deciding in legislation on this floor, it's not in the rules necessarily, but I certainly think in last session we informally agreed that this would be done. I just wanted to call this to your attention. Go ahead and adjourn.

SPEAKER: Thank you Senator Syas. Is there any other business to come before the body? Speaker Proud your motion was to adjourn until 10:00 tomorrow?

SENATOR PROUD: Yes.

SPEAKER: All those in favor of adjourning until 10:00 tomorrow please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, we are adjourned until 10:00 tomorrow.
