this commission and not more than 20 appointed by the Governor. This commission will be in operation for a little over a year and it does have a date when it expires and (??) then we'll remove it from the statutes of the state of Nebraska. I would move that LB 200 would be advanced to E & R for Initial.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: In the original bill, I am not opposed to the bill. In Section 4, you have an appropriation in the bill. It would be my opinion that unless you struck it out you may not have any bill at all because you can't have two subjects in a bill as long as you have an A bill following this bill I would presume he would want to do that. Or do you want to check it, then pass the bill over. Section 4. As I understand it, it appropriates \$15,000.00.

SENATOR STULL: Senator Carpenter, the reason we're having an A bill, we do want to make this money available to the commission and I don't think we could do that unless we have the A bill. It wouldn't be effective till the first of July. We will strike that out. Let's--

SPEAKER: Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, let's pass over it temporarily and I'll get an amendment up there to strike this section out of the bill so that we can advance it.

SPEAKER: Very good. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: May I say to the new members who may not know this, under the Constitution--under the law, you cannot have two subjects in any one bill. That is the reason, in part, why we have A bills which are appropriations for a bill like this. It is a separate bill. It has the same number except it is identified by the "A" rather than by the original number, so I would suggest that the new members bear that in mind in any bill they might introduce because if you have two subjects probably you won't have any bill at all.

SPEAKER: Senator Kelly, did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we had quite a bit of deliberation, I believe it was yesterday, on 101 commissions and it looks like we are going to 102. I'd like to ask Senator Stull a question.

SPEAKER: Senator Stull, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR STULL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR KELLY: If this commission were
