SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members, I would like to say that we do have areas in rural Nebraska that are also have an impact, Silver Creek in Senator Kremer's district and Genoa in my district. We have the communication center. We probably have I suppose 25 families in our town, probably more. It fluctuates. It has quite an impact on our school and we certainly couldn't afford to lose these funds.

SENATOR LEWIS: No.
