SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. Chairman, I move for a call of the house.

SPEAKER: Under the new rules, the call for the house is thus administered. The clerk will clear the board. At the next bell, you will indicate whether you want a call of the house or not. This is the question. Do you want a call of the house? Is so, vote aye, if not, vote no. Senator Duis voting aye. On the original motion? We've got to have the call of the house first. Right. This is the motion for the call of the house. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, Mr. President, 9 nays on Call of the House.

SPEAKER: Now we are under a Call of the House. Now, Senator Duis.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Duis voting aye.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis voting aye. Senator Barnett, the motion is to raise the Call. At the next bell, please indicate whether you want the Call raised or not. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. This is the vote to raise the Call of the House. Have you all voted. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, Mr. President, to raise the Call.

SPEAKER: Thank you, the call is raised. Stand by, we have a malfunction.

CLERK: Well, I can go ahead and announce the vote. The original vote, Mr. President, was 30 ayes, 1 nay.

SPEAKER: OK, the bill is introduced.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills.

SPEAKER: Read the titles.

CLERK: Read title. LB 476. That is all, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: What do you have in the way of motions on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a proposed Rule change.

SPEAKER: Read the proposed rules.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: That will be referred to the Rules Committee. Do we have other motions on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President. Read.

SPEAKER: Thank you. Are there other committee reports? Are there any other motions on the desk?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.
