outcome of this, it still has to pass this body on the floor on its merits. The only other issue I would bring up is that there are more bills in the Government Committee now than in Urban Affairs, but we must also assume that it is a two-day committee compared to a one-day committee.

SPEAKER: You've heard the motion and the debate. The question is shall LB 448 be reassigned. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is to re-refer LB 448. 25 votes to bind the body to a movement like this. All the chair would ask if you have all voted. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I move for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER: OK. The clerk will clear the board. At the next bell, please indicate your pleasure as to whether you want to vote support of a Call of the House. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: We are under Call of the House. The motion before us..the issue to be--We are under Call of the House and the motion before us and the issue to be decided is whether 448 should be re-referred or not. Senator Frank Lewis voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Frank Lewis voting aye.

SPEAKER: Senator Kime voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Kime voting aye.

SPEAKER: Senator Anderson voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Proud voting aye

SPEAKER: Senator Rasmussen voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Anderson voting aye, Senator Maresh voting aye.

SPEAKER: At the next bell, please record your presence. Please indicate your presence. Have you all recorded your presence? Thank you. The clerk will record. Stand by, Senator Goodrich. Just a moment. The clerk will clear the board. Senator Goodrich, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I move to raise the Call.

SPEAKER: The motion is to raise the Call. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no.

UNIDENTIFIED: Excuse me, I didn't hear a second to that motion.

SPEAKER: Thank you. The question is shall the Call be raised. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Under the new rules for a Call of the House, Senator Duis, does this require..the chair is asking whether this requires a simple majority or a majority of those voting or a majority of the elected members? Thank you. My Rule Book hadn't been changed. I didn't have that in here yet. The motion to raise a Call carries. Back to the original motion which was a re-reference of the bill. The clerk will read the tally now.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 9 nays, remainder not voting.

SPEAKER: Motion fails.
