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guy lay in the street with a broken leg and take care of himself. Otherwise, they would not be opposed to this bill. So again, I ask you people in the state of fairness, if we are going to do it for one, let's do it for everyone or let's not do it for anyone and I move we reject the committee's amendment.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Duis. We still have before us Senator Maresh's motion to adopt the committee amendments. Is there any--Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Just a point of clarification. Senator Maresh just said that this is unemployment compensation insurance and not workmen's compensation insurance which means it has nothing to do with broken legs.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion? Senator Maresh's committee amendment to LB 35. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Let me ask Senator Whitney, what does the bill do then?

SPEAKER: Senator Whitney, do you care to respond?

SENATOR CARPENTER: If it doesn't cover a broken leg, what does it cover?

SENATOR WHITNEY: It covers unemployment compensation insurance. Now as I understand it, I was not on the committee, what I understand is what I've read
