Stahmer is passing. We're back then to Senator Savage. Do you want to speak on the Barnett amendment?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Yes, I would like to concur with Senator Barnett's request to leave that in because, but it's all ready provided for in the bill. It says here that it provides the education for children for whom education services are not available in their own school. That's the only time that they can be sent to some other place and that's the responsibility of the Nebraska Medical Institute, to make that provision and I don't think it's necessary except until the time that we can have some facilities in Nebraska that we need to worry about whether we send them out of the State or not.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the Barnett amendment to the Carpenter amendment? Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, I'd like to say a word in support of Senator Barnett's amendment and I want to support Senator Carpenter for what he is trying to do in this measure here and it has been my considered belief that perhaps we're not going to have any earthshaking state aid to school bill passed at least in this session and I feel if we can't do anything else, the one thing we ought to do is take care of these children that have these physical handicaps and problems and I think the great majority of the people of this State would be behind us a 100
