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SENATOR FOWLER: I rise in support of Senator Marsh's motion. I'd just like to make a couple points. Senator Marsh said that the Federal Government has laws in this area already and therefore we should not get into it. I think we should look at the equal employment opportunity laws and see how that works. The Federal Government has laws in this area and the State also has laws. Now, as long as the State and Federal laws are identical, the State is able to have jurisdiction first. This is the same sort of thing that would happen with regards to the measure that Mrs. Marsh is introducing. Now if we don't have provisions then the Federal Government will be able to prosecute these cases and we'll lose local control. Now we have a commission here in Nebraska of people appointed by Nebraska Governors that would be better able, I think, to handle these cases than the Federal Government so I would just like to state that just because it is a Federal law, there is no reason that Nebraska should not also have some sort of mechanism for handling these cases.
