what we are doing, and its not my responsibility to advise you people what you're doing, you know that yourself, but insofar as I'm concerned, all you're doing is gradually precluding the necessity of holding bond elections, and because you'd advertise these dealings over whatever the period of time might be you still have the obligation to pay it back. It becomes a liability of the tax payer in the district which it creates the liability, so if we are going to do this, and it may be a good thing, I'm not in a position to say it is or not, I don't know, I'm a great person to try new things, and the only thing I want to say that it does over a period of time gradually erode the necessity of people voting on bond elections for school purposes, or any other purpose. Now you got LB 10 up on select file, which has been bracketed, which has the same general area, so I would think if you pass this bill really you don't have any need for 10, because we are eliminating all the obstructions that preclude the school districts from erecting buildings
