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give the ESU's an open ended situation, 251, gentlemen, and then this one, of course, I introduced to restrict the local school boards to 20 years and willing to take 10, but yet nothing was done about the ESU's. In other words, we must trust the ESU's further than we did the local school district. Now I didn't hear Senator Nore or anybody standing up and saying how bad L.B. 251 was. Well, he had his chance. Well, it's been debated all morning, Senator.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas, Senator Syas, just hold it, the Chair has to--

SENATOR SYAS: I would oppose killing this bill but I would say this that I think Senator Lewis' 10 years amending it if the bill isn't killed is logical. This would never be intended as a regular building program. It's just on isolated cases that we would need the 10 years. This is not the intent as Senator Lewis told you to do otherwise.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Cal Carsten. Senator Syas, I was only trying to mention to you that you can't carry on --

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(Start Belt # 10)

a conversation with somebody around you there because the rest of the body can't hear what they're asking you and all we get are just your responses. In the background telling me then. O.K. sir. Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I just want to get up and express myself on this motion to kill. I am sure that Senator Kelly is sincere in his proposal but I believe that equally as well, Senator Syas and those of us that are interested in this quite closely, are as determined not to see it go down the drain too. I think Senator Lewis explained my position very well. I would hope and say this to Senator Carpenter that he has said that we do change our mind occasionally and he does too. I would hope that he might change his mind and maybe put a time limit on this down in the 10 year level. I know that he wiped it out originally but I would speak as opposing the kill motion. Thank you.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Nore, then Senator Burbach:

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I rise to ask Senator S/as a question.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas, will you yield to a question from Senator Nore?

SENATOR NORE: Why don't you want an open end why do you want it 10 years? Is there a reason?

SENATOR SYAS: I didn't hear your question, Senator.

SENATOR NORE: Why are you against the open end and want to restrict the 10 years? Why not leave it as an open end?

SENATOR SYAS: I would rather have it 10 years, I would rather have some restriction on it, personally, because we have had
