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give us a 50% increase in salary and then we are all going to cry in our beer when we find out that the people don't have faith in us. I think we are trying to do for the people there who are not receiving adequate pay the same thing we are asking the people to do for ourselves. I think we ought to be consistent and either favor both of them or neither of them.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis:

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I realize that you probably like to see the kill motion up there, but I wonder if you just read this bill just a moment before you kill it. I think you'll find some language change in there that is absolutely necessary, and that has to do with the part time employees. We found in studying this bill and I wish Senator DeCamp would have taken this into consideration when he was talking on the bill, if you kill this bill you will have then placed language back in this bill which has been consistent with the language that should be in there because the old language of this bill tangles up in the middle of it, the part time that, that is the part time county superintendent and the part time superintendent that is county superintendent and also the part time I believe, district court clerk, and if we don't pass this bill in some form we are going to be right back where we started in the inconsistency in the bill. So therefore, I would ask for you to not to kill this bill, if you have to do something, to clear yourself of something, I don't know what it is, in setting salaries, please do it by an amendment and not by killing the bill, because the bill is necessary in one respect.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the motion to indefinitely postpone? Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, members of the body, I concur with Senator Duis to an extent concerning his salaries, his concern for salaries for the part time school superintendent, and possibly a couple of other positions. I'm wondering if that particular item of business could not be handled on either a different bill or amend this bill down to where those of us who do not want to have to be the ones to sit here and decide every salary in the state, could be satisfied. I don't have any particular bill in mind, Senator Duis, but would there not be the possibility that another bill is in this body that that same section could come under? I support the kill motion on this bill Mr. President, I know the Douglas County Board has the prerogative now to set it's own salary, I personally think that's the way it should be. If they can't stand the heat in their own home town, I don't know where they are going to stand it, and I think that is a better check on salaries and a better true measure of what the people feel the salaries should be, and for us to be confronted by if you will and I say this in respect and not disrespect, one of the most powerful lobbying forces that is around the Nebraska legislature, the association of county officials, I think that again we are taking up a lot of time on an issue that could be better handled on a local basis, so I support the kill motion in order that the county boards would have the jurisdiction of handling salaries in their own county.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis did you wish to be recognized again?

SENATOR DUIS: Well I thought Senator Snyder was going to ask me a question, but apparently it turned out to be a statement, but so far Senator Snyder, I haven't seen a bill in government committee or any other committee that has to do with these two sections of the statute, and what I have reference to is the Standing Committee amendment to the bill. The Standing Committee to the bill, if you will read closely, I think is a necessity in this legislation, therefore, if you kill this
