SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendment? Question--Senator Whitney. We have before the body the Goodrich amendment to L.B. 247.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Just briefly, I'm in favor of the amendment. I think it does clarify it. It still then would require clarification of demand deposits but not investments. They would not have to pro rate in that regard.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendment. Question is shall the amendment be adopted. All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the amendment is adopted. Senator Goodrich, we're back to you. What is your pleasure?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would move that the bill be advanced to general, or, E&R initial as amended. Does anybody want -- questions, we thoroughly hashed this bill out the other day. If anybody has any questions, I will be glad to answer them, otherwise, I'll just quit talking.

SPEAKER: Once again, is there any further discussion of the bill? Question is shall L.B. 247 as amended be advanced from general file to E&R initial. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Voting on the advancement of L.B. 247 as amended. Have you all voted? Voting on the advancement of L.B. 247 as amended from general file to E&R initial. Once again, have you all voted. The Clerk will record. 29 something. We had a malfunction there. Would you please vote again on the bill. Voting on the general file advancement of L.B. 247. We are asking you to vote again on L.B. 247. Have you all voted. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on motion to advance.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. We will next take up the general file consideration of L.B. 72. That is also Senator Goodrich's bill.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and Members of the body. L.B. 72 is a constitutional amendment proposal and the best way to describe this bill since it's a one-paragraph bill, is to read the actual paragraph right out of it. It boils down to one thing though, there is a motion pending on the desk which I want to call your attention to that we will take up in a minute or two and that section says (read).

SPEAKER: Senator Goodrich, stand by just a moment, will you, till the Clerk reads the title on this. I thought it had been read before.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K.

CLERK: Mr. President, the title to L.B. 72 introduced by Senator Goodrich (read). There are no committee amendments.
