that the investigators have turned these requests down. That there have not been enough investigators under our State Patrol to handle them.

SENATOR KIME: Now, I don't know about the State Patrol. They are concerned mostly with the highway department and not especially with cattle theft or disease and anything like that. They are not specialized in that and no, I don't think they should be under the Highway Patrol.

SENATOR BARNETT: It might be a real good idea but to me, with your background as sheriff knowledge and everything, I would think that you could see that this thing might open up seventy agencies wanting enforcement officers and it scares me to death. I might make one comment down here on that fiscal note, it says, "the use of a motor pool lease car rather than auto purchase would effect some savings". I guarantee if it passes would you tell that guy to try to change that. Tell him not to use the motor pool car if it passes, would you do that?

SENATOR KIME: Well, of course, now..

SENATOR BARNETT: He's taking his life in his own hands.

SENATOR KIME: I know what you are talking about and, of course, there is certain cars assigned to the Agriculture Department. One of those cars would be used. Of the cars they already have on hand, one of those cars will be used.

SENATOR BARNETT: Then, what's the difference between an unmarked car..you say he will be able to use an unmarked car.

SENATOR KIME: Yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: What's the other type he could use?

SENATOR KIME: Well, any other type is the usual type.

SENATOR BARNETT: Are you talking about a red light or..

SENATOR KIME: (inaudible) with the red lights on top or anything like that. If you have a suspect out here in this neighborhood, this is going to be mostly in the country, this is going to be rural investigation, and you drive around out there in that country and your suspect sees you, you are going to spook him out of the country and all his stuff with him. The evidence is going to be gone.

SENATOR BARNETT: That's right, we both spook people.

SENATOR KIME: We know that.

SENATOR BARNETT: Ya, that's right. Well, I wish you luck if you really want the bill but to me it looks like it's just going to open up a whole new field of investigators and I really don't know that we need them.

SENATOR KIME: Well, I..I don't believe that, Wally.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, if you will recall, we went through about this same type of a discussion when we were authorizing the Games and Parks Commission Officers to do about the same thing. Now, this is in effect now and it is working very well. I am sure it will in the Department of Agriculture. I think Senator Snyder asked a real important question. In the bill itself in the new language on Page 4, you will notice there is a limitation as to the powers and I quote, "except that there powers and duties shall be restricted to the enforcement of the laws of the state of Nebraska within the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture."
