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someone who can answer the intent of this bill and the question is, is this intended to cover only passenger vehicles, cars, or is it intended to cover all motor vehicles.

SPEAKER: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Anderson, these people ride in either an automobile or many of them have what we call a van type, like one of these big Volkswagens, see, so they can get in--

SENATOR ANDERSON: It could include something that would be licensed as a commercial truck, too, then?

SENATOR KEYES: Oh no, they are not, we are not licensing commercial vehicles. This is a private license.

SENATOR ANDERSON: You are talking only about passenger vehicles?

SENATOR KEYES: Passenger vehicles, yes. This is their private car, the one that lives, boy that lives in Papillion can wheel it out and get in this and his wife and him can go downtown. They can wheel themselves out--and this costs extra money to have this--it isn' an ordinary car and they pay the sales tax on this. I didn't know when I introduced this, I thought that, I could see no opposition to it whatsoever, the free license plate, it may cost the State of Nebraska a couple of bucks to make these and they will give them to these people and that's all I ask for them to do. I don't mind paying \$15 or \$17.00 for mine or another dollar or \$18.00, whatever it costs, another dollar or two dollars more, but for these people to have to pay for this, seems out of the world.

SPEAKER: The Clerk now has an amendment to the Whitney amendment. Read the amendment.

CLERK: Amendment read.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, this gives us a chance for Senator Keyes to have a rerun of what we're talking about here and rather than the word free, at no cost and I would like to see this amendment passed because I think if more of the Senators had been available at the time and Senator Keyes hadn't had such a short explanation the vote would have gone in that favor anyway, so this would be, Senator Keyes, back to what you originally wanted anyway..

SPEAKER: Do you all understand the Mahoney amendment to the Whitney amendment. Do you need that read? Question is shall the Mahoney amendment be adopted. All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered. The Mahoney amendment is adopted. We are now back to the Whitney amendment as amended. Now, Senator Whitney, is there any further discussion of your amendment? Any further discussion of Senator Whitney's amendment? Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and Members of the body. I think I oppose the amendment as now amended and, for several reasons, one of which, it does not in any way in this bill clarify what is a motor vehicle so anything that would be designated as a motor vehicle would qualify under the present language, it looks to me like. I don't think that these people are really looking for sympathy, they are looking for aid if
