SENATOR CARPENTER: Read the final reading first.

SPEAKER: I believe that would be preferable unless you object to it.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, no, no, that's all right, thank you.

SPEAKER: Well, we're ready for final reading. Senator Duis. Then Senator Keyes.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature and Senator Carpenter, we will take up the rule changes this morning. The committee has acted on the rules and they are ready to go and stated here, as far as we know there are no A bills on final reading and I would request then, Mr. President, that after final readings, we will take up the rule changes. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Mr. President. I think Senator Barnett, whose bill is 144, should read on the third page, starting with line 12 or 13 or 14 and read the next four or five lines because, it's very inconsistent in what it means.

SPEAKER: All right. We're ready for final reading now. All Senators will please take their seats. The first bill on final reading is L.B. 12.

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion on the desk.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Motion read.

SPEAKER: Any objections. If not, it is so ordered. L.B. 69. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. Just a point of information, 101 on final reading today does have an A bill so there would be an effect on the rules. I'm for the bill but I was only bringing it up as a matter of information.

SPEAKER: I'm sorry. Whose bill is that. That Senator Schmit's bill. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, that bill was on final reading and I'm sorry, Senator Carpenter, but it, and I was mistaken, it was brought back for the emergency clause if I'm correct. Is this right? Well, I'm wondering why it's on final reading. That's the reason I was curious because I thought it had been on final reading before and was brought back for emergency clause and I didn't know when that got back to select file for that specific amendment.

SPEAKER: Senator Schmit is not here, is that correct? Does anybody have any objection to bracketing that bill and taking it up when Senator Schmit gets back. Is there any objection to that? If not, it is so ordered. That was L.B. 101? All right, it stands bracketed and Senator Schmit can look into it when he returns. The next bill is L.B. 69. Clerk will read.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 69. (read). Mr. President, there is a report of the rules committee on page, an unknown page, 369 of the Legislative Journal, and this in turn refers to rule changes which are set out in full in the Legislative Journal on earlier pages. Do you want to take them in the order they are listed, Senator?
