

(Start of Belt #4)

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, "Shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached?" All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Once again, the chair would inquire if you have all voted? Have you all voted. The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Read vote. 29 ayes, 17 nays, 3 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill fails to receive the necessary two-thirds majority in order to pass with the emergency clause. The clerk will clear the board, please. The question now is, "Shall the bill pass with the emergency clause stricken". All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: Vote read. 29 ayes, 17 nays, 3 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill is passed with the emergency clause stricken. That concludes Final Reading for this morning. Do we have any Resolutions on the desk?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Are there any bills for introduction?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Very good. We're ready for the consideration of bills on Select File, beginning with LB 102. Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: Someone gave me this. It says, "Please return", and I want to know whose it is. Who do I return it to? No name on it. Yours. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh, we are ready for the bills on Select File. Excuse me. Right. Are we ready?

UNIDENTIFIED: I had put 132 at the end.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh, stand by. We'll take up 132 here first which was Senator Burbach's bill that he asked to be returned for specific amendments. Stand by. Senator Burbach, your 132 has a little priority here. Will the clerk read the specific amendments.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Members of the Legislature, the other day when we discussed this bill as originally drafted, the 3% would have amounted to \$200,000 if you will recall these figures. The proper amendment without the amendment that was adopted that I offered here on the floor, it would have brought in about \$63,000 to \$64,000. I must admit that I was a little concerned that it did not bring it down to that figure rather than the \$200,000, but I went a little too far. It only brings in \$16,000 which is not sufficient. This will reinsert it from the...reinsert the amendments offered by the committee and to the bill. I move for the adoption of the amendments.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendments? You have heard the amendments and the discussion. All those in favor of the amendments as explained by Senator Burbach vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Senator Burbach is
