SENATOR GOODRICH: And substituted the amendment by, which in essence, struck all of line 4.

CLERK: Well, okay, what we did the other day was a series of amendments to a pending amendment, in order to get it in, the Whitney amendment amended the Dickinson amendment, the Carpenter amendment again amended the Dickinson amendment which struck the Dickinson amendment, and this amendment to that amendment was adopted, now you need to adopt the amendment as amended, which is what you've essentially done.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay.

SPEAKER: Do you have any other questions Senator Goodrich?

SENATOR GOODRICH: If we are up to that point, then really you're explaining to Senator Dickinson, his amendment is in error because his amendment as it is right now, is nothing more than the Carpenter amendment which is strike all of the line 4.

CLERK: That is right Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, let's go.

SPEAKER: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: I move to indefinitely postpone my amendment, I move to withdraw my amendment.

SPEAKER: Well, alright, Senator Dickinson is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his amendment now to LB 252. Senator Stahmer do you want to speak to that? Senator Goodrich do you wish to speak to that? Are there objections to Senator Dickinson withdrawing his motion, his motion to LB 252, hearing none, so ordered. The amendment is withdrawn. It's a little late it is withdrawn. The Clerk read it twice. Now, Senator Carpenter, just a minute, Senator Stahmer we have LE 252 now before the body.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President I have a question of the clerk. Mr. Clerk I'm not sure, did we have an amendment to amendment to amendment on this, how many amendments did we have, and how many did the rules allow? Did we abide by the rules on those amendments?

CLERK: Yes sir.

SENATOR STAHMER: Thank you.

CLERK: You can have an amendment to an amendment, but once that's adopted, you can then again amend, which is what happened.

SENATOR STAHMER: Which is what we did.

SPEAKER: Well, now, the Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter, Senator Goodrich, how can I determine when both of you are up on the floor and both of you are motioning, alright Senator Carpenter yields to Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: This is a point of clarification, it would now appear to me that we are back to the original bill. Mr. Clerk am I correct? That's right we are back to the original bill, in the original form that it was proposed on the floor here, which in essence says, not more, not more than fifty acres, and we have stricken twenty five and substituted fifty, that's all in the world the bill is doing and we are back to the original bill, for those of you who are trying to follow it. The main purpose behind the bill was to as I mentioned before, increase
