SPEAKER: Do you all understand the amendment? The question is shall the Lewis amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. You are voting on the adoption of the Lewis amendment. The chair would ask if you have all voted. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 3 nays, 23 not voting.

SPEAKER: The Lewis amendment is adopted. Are there other amendments on the desk.

CLERK: Yes. Read.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: It's the same motion I made on the previous bill. I move for its adoption.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion on the Carpenter amendment. Senator Maresh, did you wish to be recognized? The question is shall the Carpenter amendment..Senator Syas, did you wish to speak on this.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes, just one question. Will Senator Carpenter put his name on the bill, so I can get mine off?

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter, do you care to respond?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, what happens to the ten bills I've got in?

SENATOR SYAS: I don't think it counts, in this particular case after the 20th day, does it?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Then I ask unanimous consent that Senator Syas take his name off and I put mine on, providing I don't lose one of the ten I've got.

SPEAKER: Well, we have a motion pending. Stand by, we'll take you up on that in a minute.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, then I will take it out.

SPEAKER: Just a minute. We still have before the body Senator Carpenter's amendment. Is there any further discussion of that amendment. Senator Duis, do you want to speak on the amendment? All right. Senator Carpenter, do you have any closing remarks on your amendment? The question is shall the Carpenter amendment to LB 197 be adopted. All those in favor of the Carpenter amendment, please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. The Carpenter amendment is adopted. Now, are there other amendments on the desk?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Stand by, Senator Carpenter. We have another amendment on the desk here, sir. Go ahead, read.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Barnett.
