

think we can do it in a right manner until we do have it printed so I concur and I'm glad that Senator Jules has withdrawn his motion.

SPEAKER: Thank you. Now, Senator Simpson are you passing or do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. No, I'm not passing because I think we have an issue here that has already gone too far. I think when the Speaker of the Legislature says that it shall be printed in the Journal and it is a communication to the Legislature, there is no issue of whether you agree or disagree, that it should have been printed with no more discussion. Then if you wish to talk about the issue as it is there, that's an entirely different story. When we sent this resolution in, I didn't see anything come back from them that they voted 3 to 2 not to accept it and send the resolution back because they didn't agree with our position and we should not either take that position on their answer.

SPEAKER: Very good. Chair next recognizes Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow Members, I would withdraw my objection. The only purpose of objecting is the getting this, this discourse that we have had this morning and as far as Senator Syas is concerned, I hope that every newspaper in the State of Nebraska carries our thoughts on this whole operation of the Department of Agriculture. It's real serious. It's a very badly managed mess.

SPEAKER: Well, all right, now, we still have--Senator Luedtke's light is on, Senator Luedtke, are you through. Senator Syas, are you through? The Chair now understands that we don't have any objections to printing it in the Journal and so the issue is now disposed of, is that satisfactory with the body? O.K. we're in agreement. Senator Proud, turn off your light, Senator Nore turn off your light then we will start all over again. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Read the communication.

CLERK: Communication read. This also will be inserted in the Journal.

SPEAKER: Thank you. Well, we have no bills on final reading unless somebody cares to unbracket something. Is there any communication from the floor regarding that? Is there any, to unbracket anything on final reading. O.K. Do we have any resolutions? Any bills for introduction?

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion (read). Bill read.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Maresh. What is your pleasure, Senator?

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, I move that this bill would be introduced. The purpose of this bill is to bring about inspection of boilers that may not be safe. I understand in South Dakota at a public demonstration a boiler blew up one time and they feel that this should be mandatory that these antique boilers would be inspected and also, it does away with hydrostatic testing which they have found to be a stress on the boilers and makes them unsafe in the future so I move that this bill be introduced.
