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SENATOR KEYES: No, but I carry a license to operate boilers and to operate in the state of Nebraska and I want to know what you're talking about.

SENATOR MARESH: Are you talking about homemade boilers?

SENATOR KEYES: I am talking about this one that runs around the State Fair and..

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, those...I thought you meant little toys. You are talking about those that are used for rides. Yes, those are just as dangerous as a big one. Some of these people make their own boilers and this would require that these would be inspected before they can be operated at a public demonstration. This would not prevent someone from operating their own boiler at home but as soon as you use them for a public demonstration they'll require to be inspected, and I think that's a...

SENATOR KEYES: Are they low pressure or high pressure boilers that you are talking about?

SENATOR MARESH: I can't tell you this. I don't know enough about boilers to tell which class will be included but I imagine any boiler would be included.

SENATOR KEYES: Now this bill...is this bill going to say that they do have a hydrostatic pressure test or they don't.

SENATOR MARESH: They will not be required to undergo a hydrostatic test because this has been found to be hard on the boilers.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, it's not near as hard on the boilers as it is on the man if the boiler blows. I've been in and I know what I'm talking about. Boilers do have relief valves so....

SPEAKER: Senator Keyes. Excuse me, the chair would like to just mention again that the motion before discussion is whether the bill should be introduced or not and that's really the issue and we can debate, you know, the contents of the bill after it's introduced and after we have it on the floor but, really right now, it would seem more germane that we either object to or concur with the introduction of the bill and I know you have to have some discussion but would you limit it, please.

SENATOR KEYES: I am just laying down some ground work because if this is going to remove the hydrostatic pressure then I want to oppose the introducing of the bill.

SPEAKER: Good point.

SENATOR KEYES: To save a lot of argument.

SPEAKER: Very good. Is there any further discussion of Senator Mares's motion. Rule 5, section 5 says that it takes 30 votes in order to introduce a new bill. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on a motion to introduce a new bill as explained by Senator Mares. Once again the chair would ask if you have all voted? The chair does think it necessary to point out to you that it takes 30 votes for the introduction of a new bill. Senator Mares asking for a Call of the House. The clerk will clear the board. At the next bell, please indicate whether you wish a Call of the House or not. You are voting on a Call of the House. The question is shall there be a Call of the House. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: Senator Fellman voting aye...
