

of the amendment. Senator, did you move the adoption of the amendment? If there is no further discussion of the amendment, all those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. The amendment is adopted. Any other committee amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Senator Moylan

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. Chairman and Members of the Legislature. Senator Luedtke pretty well described this bill. It is one introduced by the Welfare Committee that, it seems as though dependent children had not, their residency had not been determined as other people such as legal settlement for the assistance to the aged, the blind, the disabled and if this bill passes, the 20% share absorbed by the counties will be absorbed by the State in the same manner that other dependent people are taken care of in the committee, mostly a verification in the statutes, to get coordination among all the people that are receiving Medic Aid principally. I move the bill be advanced to E&R for initial.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Ask the Senator a question. There will be an A bill follow this, then? Well, if the State is going to pay something, more than it does now, certainly somebody is going to spend some money.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Well, that's very possible but I think it's taken care of under Section 68115, now possibly Senator Luedtke could explain that better than I could.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I may be wrong but I thought that they said that they were already doing this in all but a couple instances and it is in their budget request. I think that the Budget Committee probably should, fiscal analyst should look into this to make sure though that they have provided for this in their budget request.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Ask the question so the Clerk would understand he would not have to correlate this bill with an A bill.

SPEAKER: I would suggest that Senator Moylan, though, Senator Carpenter, would double check with the Welfare Department or the fiscal analyst to see that this has been done.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: It is marked on the bill there is no fiscal impact.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, then for clarification, it is understood then that you will get whatever money is necessary in the budget if you're going to get it.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: That's as far as I know, yes, but it should be appropriated that way because it says there is no fiscal impact and it won't amount to \$50,000.00 I don't think, unless there is, there is no need of an A bill.

SENATOR CARPENTER: My only point is, I don't want the Clerk to hold your bill up waiting for an A bill.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, I appreciate that.

SENATOR CARPENTER: If you're willing to take a chance with the Budget Committee, that's fine with me.
