

SPEAKER: All those in favor of the E&R amendments to L.B. 201 please say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the amendment is adopted.

SENATOR EPKE: Now, we'll have to move that 201 be advanced.

SPEAKER: All right, the motion now is to advance L.B. 201 as amended. All those in favor of advancing L.B. 201 as amended, please say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the bill as amended is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion on the desk.

SPEAKER: Read the motion.

CLERK: Motion read.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Epke.

SENATOR EPKE: What we're striking out of the amendment is the wording "and the Livestock theft laws of this State." It doesn't weaken the bill any by taking this out and more or less, the bill now has the meaning that we intended in the first place. I visited with Senator Carpenter about this yesterday. He has no objection to taking this out of the bill so I would move that the amendment be attached.

SPEAKER: Question is, shall the bill be returned to select file for specific amendment as requested by Senator Epke. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Senator Epke is asking you to return L.B. 201 to select file for a specific amendment. That takes 25 votes. Thank you, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes on the motion to return.

SPEAKER: Now, Senator Epke, we need your motion for the amendment.

SENATOR EPKE: I now move that we amend L.B. 201 with the specific amendment.

SPEAKER: Now then, are there, is there any further discussion of the amendment? All those in favor of that amendment, please say aye. Excuse me, it takes 25 votes, excuse me. All those in favor of that amendment, vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on Senator Epke's amendment to L.B. 201 on select file. That takes 25 votes. Senator Epke is trying to adopt his amendment to L.B. 201 on select file. Stand by. Senator Epke's motion needs 25 votes. Thank you, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes on the motion to adopt.

SPEAKER: The motion is adopted.

SENATOR EPKE: Mr. President, would it be in order now to advance the bill back to E&R?

SPEAKER: Yes sir.

SENATOR EPKE: I so move, that we advance L.B. 201 to E&R.

SPEAKER: Motion now is to advance L.B. 201 as amended. All those in favor of readvancing the bill please say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the bill as amended is advanced. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to be excused on the 19th, 20th and 21st, signed Senator Burbach, Carsten and Epke.
