council of any city shall have the right and authority to exercise all powers over such street as may, as it may over streets within it's corporate limits with and you scratch or without the cooperation and concurrence of the county board of the governing body of any other municipality. What it boils down to, Senator Dickinson is they can do on this street whatever they want to do as far as joint jurisdiction is concerned, they, whatever they want to do though, they have to arrive at the agreement ahead of time. The original intent of the bill was to accomodate the problem of police jurisdiction, however after discussing the issue we got into the, well lets let them do whatever the two governing bodies want to do, and they have to concur, they both have to concur in that, in this agreement that they arrive at before they do it.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Thank you Senator Goodrich, I guess this is what happens when we have a week's interval in a discussion, it probably should all be held in one day, thank you.

SENATOR GOODRICH: You're right.

SPEAKER: The Chair would next like to recognize Senator Keyes. Speaking on LB 71, Senator Goodrich's bill.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I'd like to ask Senator Goodrich a question?

SPEAKER: Okay, will you yield Senator?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Goodrich, what is wrong, why do we just make it a metropolitan city, what is wrong with letting any entity of Government who have a common boundry on a street have jurisdiction over the whole thing. Now I know that you may think that is wrong, but you are going just to the metropolitan city of Omaha, and that only goes out to about a hundred and thirtieth we've got from there on out to four hundred street in Sarpy County.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, Senator Keyes, what is obvious here, is that several members of this body have not applied the committee amendment to the bill and that's the one we agreed in, in that conference before we held the public hearing on the bill. We were talking to your county commissioners and numerous other people and when we apply the committee amendments to the bill, it achieves just what you are asking for, it is not limited to metropolitan cities anymore. This covers all cities of the state and counties of the state, they can do whatever they want to once they have arrived at a joint and, both sides have agreed to it in a agreement ahead of time.

SENATOR KEYES: But it has nothing to do with cities and counties within the same county jurisdiction of a street that -

SENATOR GOODRICH: If they have a county boundry, going through this city or between two cities or between two
