because he was stopped and some young boys came along and because of his condition did rob him. I don't know how many people because they carry a paraplegic sign on their license plate, the motor says stop, I don't stop and help people today, but if I saw a paraplegic sign and a man along the side of the road, I undoubtedly would not be afraid to stop. So I would hope that you would pass this bill, accept the amendment that I have on the desk, Senator Whitney and Senator Mahoney's amendment and then accept my amendment so that they can't go into the commercial business with this license and go ahead.

SPEAKER: Now Senator Nore you still want to be recognized?

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, fellow members, I don't think we're in too much difficulty, on these exemptions, we have a problem of a sorta cannibalism, one, one taxing body, taxing another, and eventually they will all be bleeding, and loose their feathers, so I don't think we're, this is a problem at all, I think we can go ahead and vote in favor of 176 and I don't think the Lincoln folks want to go back and tax the transcient system, the Omaha transcient system, doesn't want to tax their buses, so let's, this is really not a problem.

SPEAKER: Okay, Senator Fred Carstens, did you wish to be heard on this issue again?

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: I believe it has been discussed enough, I waive any.

SPEAKER: Thank you sir, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, it seems to me that there are other people involved also, who are worse off then some of these people, maybe we should amend this bill to include everybody who is unfortunate, and, but we are getting into problems with reference to county treasurers, they're going to have to make investigations in these cases, and the county officials now are saying that the legislature putting such a great burden on their backs to make investigations and to do this and to do that, that it's increasing their property taxes, and it just seems to me that this amendment should not be accepted, but my amendment should be accepted as a whole because there the state would make a license plate which would have the wheel chair sign on the license plate and give that free to them, so far as that extra stylized plate is concerned, but then we would just charge them the regular price and there will be problems in this because how many automobiles might be involved with reference to a single person who may own several automobiles. So this bill is complicated and I would prefer that this amendment to my amendment not be accepted.

SPEAKER: Well, Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: Mr. President would Senator Mahoney yield to a question?

SPEAKER: Senator Mahoney will you yield?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: Senator Mahoney, actually we are not talking about the elimination of taxes here are we, we are only talking about the elimination of the fees, the extra fees required of making the special license plates?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes. There is no taxes involved in this amendment, this would be the fifteen dollar registration fee, that's all that you are exempting, no taxes, your not getting
