sticker shall be permanently affixed to all motor vehicles and the reason for the, changing it to this language is so that someone can't buy a sticker and then move it from one vehicle to another so that it has to be permanently affixed. On page 3, addition of (read). In other words, what this does is that it provides that those areas where the Game Commission has an agreement with the landowner, that those landowners do not have to have a sticker to drive their vehicles across their own property. Page 4, line 2, provides for \$5. for a permit and strikes the language (read). On page 4, lines 4 and 5, provides that the permit may be purchased by any person. Previously, it said that it had to be purchased by a registered, licensed motor vehicle owner, so this provides that any person may be able to purchase the permit. Page 4, line 7 provides for the temporary permit to be \$1. Page 4, line 13, again refers to permanently attaching the sticker to the vehicle and page 4, line 14, adds the word "motor" to motor vehicles. Page 5, line 1, provides a fee of .15¢ for the vendor instead of .25¢. Page 5, line 10, provides that the Commission may designate the dates for which the permit shall be required for any permanent area. This indicates that the Commission may determine that at a certain time of the year one area or another may, does not require to have a permit. It leaves the discretion up to the Game Commission. Page 5, line 13 again refers to motor vehicles. Page 5, line 18, motor vehicles, page 5, line 19 provides the word "motor" and refers again to permanently affixing the sticker. Page 6, line 2 provides (read), has to do with the penalty section and page 6, line, all of section 15, provides (read). If there are any questions, I'll try to answer them.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yeah. On, how would these amendments or do these amendments affect an individual who just wants to come into a park, say someone is driving through and wants to have a picnic lunch just for half an hour or so, do these amendments in any way affect that situation?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I believe the amendments provide that if an area is designated as a permanent area by the Commission, they shall be required to have a sticker but they can purchase a one-day sticker for \$1.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: So, it would probably cost them a \$1 just to eat their lunch--

SENATOR SCHMIT: That's right.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Even though it was only half an hour. The reason I ask this, you said something about that they could designate areas. Could it be possible that under that authority that the Game Commission could designate certain picnic areas as sometimes the Federal Government does under their stamp system where they could come in without a fee.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, they could, Senator Luedtke, and they very likely would. There would probably be picnic areas that would be provided.
