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don't want to take the money to set up these camp, camping grounds, we don't want to take it out of the hunting and fishing or out of the general appropriations, the people who are using these are going to pay for them and nobody, Senator Luedtke will be able to come in, into a park that is designated as a camping area which charges a fee and go in and use those facilities and then go on without paying the \$1 for the day. If they don't want to pay for what we offer them in this State, then they shouldn't be going there. After all, this is something that we who use the parks are going to do. Now, I know this much, that I traveled this summer in Colorado, Montana, Texas and all the rest of the states, and when I went into a state grounds, they didn't have a man standing there, they had a little box and these are probably the most honest people in the world, you stuck \$2 in there; if you wanted to you gave them the license number on your car, your name and they would send you a thank you; but if you didn't want to, you just stuck \$2 in there, you went down and were able to use the facilities. Now if you wanted to be dishonest, you didn't have to pay the \$2. One place it was \$4, but when it was \$4, I had a place I could take a shower, my wife had a place she could go in and wash a few clothes and hang them up. We had a wonderful place, heated rest rooms and all. So, I think this is probably one of the finest things that you ever seen and it will mean that the people that are going to use these are going to pay for them and we have certain parks and we're not going to let the Game Commission take the money that comes in from this and spend it on parks all over the State, but only on those parks that are designated a camping area and are subject to the fee.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Answer to the question that was about the wayside areas. It's a yes and no and I say it this way. If the Game department would designate them as needing, in order for you to use them, you would have to pay the \$1, you would have to pay the \$1. If they designated that you didn't have to, or any other place that you didn't have to, you wouldn't pay nothing. It's as simple as that, it's whatever the Game department designates as where you would have to pay your money. Some of these will not be designated as requiring the fee and some areas, parks will be requiring a fee. It's as simple as that, some, it's up to the Game department of what ones they, what parks they want to require a fee and what not. What recreation areas they want to require a fee and what not. That's under the amendment, Senator Luedtke.
