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the money were, if the money were channeled into the maintenance of these areas and as Senator Keyes has pointed out many other states have a user fee and they have used the money well and it has provided for very good recreation areas. Now, in so far as those areas along the interstate are concerned, I'm confident those areas are under the supervision of the Department of Roads. The Game Commission has no jurisdiction along the interstate. It is only those rest areas along the state highways where the Game Commission at this time does have jurisdiction and if Senator Syas and Senator Luedtke will stop visiting over there and listen, I may not have to go over this again but I would hope that...

SPEAKER: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yeah.

SPEAKER: Would you like to do the chair a favor and back off of your microphone or push away from it. You know you figured out how to get right up on that and you deal us a fits up here because we have to adjust the volume. Senator Luedtke, for instance, is a little softer spoken and we just almost go up the wall. Now, back off, please, just a little bit. We'll turn it up to the regular volume and try it again. Now, I think you have his attention also, now.

SENATOR SCHMIT: OK. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Thank you.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I'm just trying to compete with Senator Syas who also dominates the microphone a bit.

SPEAKER: Yes, he's another one that deals us fits, too. You can hear him without the mikes. Go ahead, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Now in regard to Senator Nore's comments and I think that his comments are, at least by me, are well taken. I know that there is a serious concern on the part of a lot of persons including I'm sure members of the Budget Committee that we spend more money in the collection of these fees than we actually will take in and in the past, this has been true but the projection now is not that way in this bill. We expect to take in about \$600,000 and have an impact of about \$180,000 for collection purposes. I'd just like to say that the other alternative, of course, is a General Fund appropriation and that has not been met with wild enthusiasm by members of this body. I think that we need to recognize that we are going to have an increase demand for park areas and I'm sure that Senator Syas and Luedtke are the type of people who like to use these areas and they are going to have to be paid for and provided for us and I think that if the Commission determines that it is feasible and practical to designate a roadside, a roadside area as one of those areas which is going to be...where they are going to require a user fee, then that's the way it should be. I know that, that there has been a lot of demand for these areas and I know that a lot of people are going to use them and I know that in five or ten years from now we are going to have an increased demand and unless we take steps at this time to upgrade these areas, we are going to have complaints far worse than the complaint about charging the dollar, if we have areas that are not well maintained and the Game Commission is only trying to take this route to provide adequate facilities, clean facilities for the tourists who use this...these areas. I think that if we don't do it, then we have to face the music and appropriate the money from the General Fund.

SPEAKER: All right. Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, Mr. President, I'm still back to the point of the casual user of these parks for picnic purposes
