SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, these were the bills we had Friday, but we didn't have the, enough 30 votes at any one time, and now we have placed on your desk a brief description of what the bill is itself, and of course it has to have the 30 votes to be introduced and sent back to the committee.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the bill? The Chair finds itself also in, that I've gotten myself in a bind because in answering Senator Barnett's question awhile ago, even though these were all four committee bills, I asked you for a motion to suspend the rules and I thought that the motion to suspend the rules would allow you to just vote individually on the bills, that didn't really accomplish anything, so the Chair apologizes for wasting your time on that, the question is shall this bill be introduced, all those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no, excuse me is there further discussion of the request to introduce the bill? Alright, all those in favor of the introduction of the bill, vote aye, all those opposed vote no. It takes 30 votes in order to introduce the bill. Thank you, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Okay, the bill is introduced. Take up the next one.

CLERK: Request #770 (read).

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President this bill is laid on your desk for explanation, this allows advertising in the newspapers to actually list the amount of price per the article that is to be sold instead of prohibiting as it is now, you'd probably use as an example this liquor which is not allowed to have the price on it.

SPEAKER: You've heard the explanation of the bill, is there further discussion of the motion? All those in favor of introducing the bill, Senator Savage did you wish to be recognized? All those in favor of introducing the bill will quote aye, all those opposed will vote no. The Chair cannot be in a position of lobbying for votes. The Chair would remind you it takes 30 votes for the introduction of a bill. Thank you. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is introduced.

CLERK: Request 769 (read).

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Moylan.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. President and members of the legislature, this bill was discussed considerably last Friday but was not voted on because of the short membership here. I would ask that this bill be introduced, if anyone wants more information I'd be glad to do it.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the bill? Any questions of Senator Moylan? The question is shall the bill be introduced, all those in favor will vote, yes sir. What was your last comment Senator?

SENATOR MOYLAN: I would ask for 30 votes on this please.

SPEAKER: Thank you sir. The question is shall the bill be introduced, all those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Once again have you all voted? The Clerk will record.
