SENATOR DUIS: I think I'd like to talk to the Educational Service Units and especially a gentlemen from Ogallala about this because I think he's like to hear from me.

SPEAKER: Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, Senator Barnett has not put that in there, it merely amends the present privilege of lease purchase of real estate and says you can do the same thing with the equipment and there is no yearly limitation on his amendment and I think, Vince Brown our Clerk, I think Vince Brown our Clerk would say that there is no limitation on years so far as this equipment, lend lease purchase is concerned, with reference to Senator Barnett's amendment.

CLERK: His amendment contains no reference to such.

SENATOR WHITNEY: So Senator Duis, you have no problem.

SPEAKER: Actually we have before us a unanimous consent motion now, if somebody objects fine and dandy, that terminates the discussion on it, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: I still want to discuss this with Senator Whitney, because he has brought up a point here, I would like to have this entire bill read, not just this one amendment, because I think you're going to find that this entire bill has got a ten year limit in it.

CLERK: This is correct, the other section has the ten year -

SENATOR DUIS: Alright, now let me tell you something about these other sections, the very thing that I'm having difficulty with, with these unfortunate children came about because of two sections in the statute, and they go back to the other section as a reference the DAS did and picked up another section as to have reference to the other section, and I tell you this will scare you before you get through as to how the courts will interpret these laws. Now you say the one section is ten years, and this one has no limitation.

CLERK: This is correct.

SENATOR DUIS: I'll tell you, you just go right ahead and do it, but keep your feet braced when they get ready to interpret it, because I just went through one of these interpretations.

SPEAKER: Alright, do we have any objections to the motion? Senator Barnett any further discussion?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I wouldn't be against bracketing this bill for a couple of days, to make sure that Senator Duis is pleased with this, I'm concerned that if he thinks there is something we should be concerned with, I'm in favor of doing it, if it would be agreeable, so I would withdraw my first unanimous consent and ask unanimous consent to bracket the bill for about two days.
