SENATOR CLARK: That I realize but he is also including them if it does have eminent domain, he is including the units to have eminent domain.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Yes, he is amending a different statute, but as I understand it, it's germane because it's the same definite subject.

SENATOR CLARK: Alright, thank you.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise to answer Senator Clark. The eminent domain stuff is all in 252, 197 is strictly rents and lease purchase. Rents and lease purchase are in 197 and we are limiting it to 10 years for the ESU's also.

SPEAKER: Now we actually have before the body, Senator Barnett's motion, now Senator Kremer do you want to speak on Senator Barnett's motion, it's a unanimous consent motion, if anybody objects why that knocks it off for today. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, that's what I want to do, I want to object. For this reason, I just happened to remember that there is another proposed amendment to this bill was laid on my desk and I just now dug it out do not have time to go into it, so I'm going to move that, well I object first of all, that stops it doesn't it, I'm going to move that the bill be bracketed for two days so we can get together, those of us that have an interest in the bill.

SPEAKER: Okay, that disposes of the unanimous consent motion. Now Senator Barnett do you want to move to -

SENATOR BARNETT: No I think that's fine, I'll withdraw my motion for unanimous consent then, I will also have the amendment that I proposed printed in the journal.

SPEAKER: Alright, any objections to bracketing 197 on select file for a couple of days, Senator Carpenter do you object? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have an amendment too, I would suggest that Senator Barnett, Senator Carpenter, and Senator Kremer and any other Senator who has an amendment agree on one amendment, so we will not have to go through the same thing four or five different times, and by that process we may never get enough votes any way.

SPEAKER: Show the Chair as voting aye. Are there any objections to bracketing the bill for a couple of days? Hearing none, so ordered, LB 197 is bracketed.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a motion, I move to return LB 249 to select file for the attached specific amendment, signed Senator Wiltse. Amendment read.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Wiltse.

SENATOR WILTSE: I have had several bits of correspondence and phone calls from some smaller municipalities or villages in the state, where they are protesting the two thousand insurance policy that is being required by this bill, I mean the five thousand insurance policy required by this bill. In one particular connection, they claimed it will cost them in excess of two hundred and sixty dollars for premiums alone which would be in excess of one half of the complete budget of the village, in another case we had something similar to this two years ago
