

Hearings. Read. Mr. President, there are a series of motions pending. One is--Read.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, members of the body, this particular bill is in reference to an action which was taken by this body last year. A General File amendment was adopted placing Webster County in the brand inspection area. Since it was a General File amendment, this meant that the farmers and stockmen in Webster County did not have a chance to voice their own reaction to whether they should be in the brand inspection area or not. I have introduced this particular bill to give them a chance to have their input, have their say at a Public Hearing. I think that since it does concern a tremendously large number of people in this one specific area it would be much better if we would take state government to them, take the Legislature to them rather than asking them to come to Lincoln.
