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and it's a point that I made two years ago, Cable television will say we are going to offer you more programing, in essence they will only go where the more affluent areas of the city are, and Senator Simpson, believe me you have 100% support on this measure from me and I hope this body will take that point in mind and disallow any filming or live transmission by Cable television from this body.

SPEAKER: Senator DeCamp and then Senator Nore.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, let's get one cotton picking thing straightened out. I don't care one diddley damn whether there is any television or no television there, I am not looking for publicity. Now Senator Barnett seems to suggest that we are only going to limit it to a certain amount of people, and that if somebody comes in and makes a buck from showing it on their TV screens, this is terrible, or if somebody gets more publicity than another person this is a crime, if he would look beyond the end of his nose, and if a lot of other people would look beyond the end of the nose, they would have discovered by this time in life, that this is a pretty hot issue. I didn't make it that way, Senator Proud introduced the resolution, whether it should have been introduced I don't know, but it is here, if you haven't received more letters on this then anything else then you haven't been reading your mail. Now if Senator Barnett will open his eyes awhile he'll find it's not going to be settled simply by sitting in there quietly and trying to keep anybody from finding out what we do. It's going to be a hot issue today, tomorrow and probably several months into the future. The solution is to get as many people informed as to what the true facts on this issue are as possible. As many people all over Nebraska, and right now probably less people understand equal rights than anything else I would say in this legislature. They all have opinions and ideas as to what the constitutional amendment means, they're going to tell you it means women are going to be in the men's can and men in the women's can and all kinds of horse manure. What we need to do is finally get some people informed as to what it does mean, and this is what Senator Barnett and Senator Snyder with their petty talk about somebody making an extra buck, to worry about. Well that's garbage, let's get as many people informed as possible and quit using silly stuff about one person getting one more inch of publicity than another, let's get this issue resolved, if we can get as many people informed as possible through Cable TV, through news media, through newspapers, that's what we ought to get done and get this handled. Quit talking like children.

SPEAKER: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members, I'd like to ask Senator Simpson a question if he would yield?

SPEAKER: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Sure.

SENATOR NORE: I have some constituents that can't afford a daily paper now, should we take out the reporters?

SENATOR SIMPSON: They don't have to take that, this is not available to them. We don't have the opportunity to buy it in my area of town.

SENATOR NORE: You mean the newspapers?

SENATOR SIMPSON: No, the television, that this is going on. We don't have it out there.
