SENATOR SYAS: All right. That's fine.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: OK.

SENATOR SYAS: Thank you. It's putting us in the hole. The Governor is asking us to bring it back and that is all I wanted to nail down. Thank you, very much.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion? Now, you've heard the motion. It's to request to the Governor to bring the bill back and if that does happen, then this body will decide what it wants to do with it. All those in favor of the motion, vote aye. Those opposed, vote no. The chair would rule that this requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays, 18 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The motion passes. Now, I presume that Senator Chambers is on his way to the Governor's of...We can send the Sergeant at Arms if you like, Senator Chambers. Sergeant at Arms will please re...All right. The Page will please repair to the Governor's office and see if she can arrest the bill from him. Now, while we are doing that, we just as well, in my judgment, proceed here because it looks like he is going to give in. Senator Carpenter, assuming the Governor returns the bill, then what do you want to do with it.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Put it on Final Reading and move it back to Select File for a specific amendment which is on the clerk's desk.
