it be something, but I don't know of any method by which you can do it and I would agree with Senator Chambers and (inaudible) that the farmer and the domestic are no different than anybody else but then we get in the process of the mechanics in the application of a bill of this kind in any case and we're now talking about, I don't know how many people, I'd say 100, maybe 150,000 people, that's just a guess, but it's a lot of people and the thing I'm, it's only one thing that these people who are, be under this bill don't know they're under this bill and they automatically become self-insured and I see no difference between a domestic service in a man or woman who works in the domestic on the farm or the ranch, they're all entitled to the same protection and I wouldn't think we'd take one out and leave the other in or anything like that any my only purpose is to let you people know and I'm not your guidance here, I'm just say-- this is what I think this bill does. I have alerted you to that and from now on I'm through with this.

SPEAKER: The Chair would say that anyone who wishes to speak to the amendment, now has that right to speak. I think, Senator Richendifer, did you wish to speak to the amendment? O.K. SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, that's what the Workman's Comp requires that, that's correct. My amendment has nothing to do with that.

SPEAKER: Do you wish to speak to the amendment, Senator Nore. O.K. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Fellow Members, I, I know what I'm going to do, I, in hiring people. I just won't hire them. We'll have a number of folks that will be unemployed, that is part time workers. Now we have hundreds and hundreds of people now that could work but we are scared to death to hire them because of the cloud of some of these laws that we have passed. We don't dare hire them. There is too much risk so we just get along without them. We buy labor saving devices and we just let the work go undone.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke, do you care to close on your amendment?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: It just changes the terminology.

SPEAKER: Everybody in favor of the amendment say aye. Those opposed say nay. The motion is carried. The Clerk will read another amendment.
