SPEAKER: Senator Barnett voting aye on the original motion.

CLERK: Senator Barnett voting aye on the original motion.

SPEAKER: Senator Chambers voting aye on the original motion.
Senator Duis voting aye on the original motion. Senator
Simpson voting aye on the original motion. Senator Fellman
voting aye on the original motion.
