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the fact that this is law, now law cannot be suspended, law cannot be gone around, law cannot be taken into consideration for a later date, it is immediate and it needs enforcement, and I for one am expecting law to be enforced. If you are speeding on a road that is marked for 75 miles an hour on the interstate and you are going 80 you are arrested. That 75 mile an hour speed limit cannot be suspended for four to six weeks. I do not know how it can if it's in the statute. Now this is very serious and I certainly hope that the state fire marshall takes this into consideration and all of his deputies and everyone else when they were telling people of the state of Nebraska and especially the volunteer fire department people, of which, who I served 25 years with, that the criticism of this legislature in the life safety code was not warranted. It is an absolute untruth that if the life safety code 101 was eliminated from the statute that it would not been in effect, because it would have been a regulation, and should be a regulation even at this present time so the administration will have control over it, of which the state fire marshall is a part of, then if this was found to be too stringent at times, it could have been relaxed or it could have been suspended for a period of time to allow for correction. Personally I do not know what we are going to do, I honestly don't. Life Safety Code 101 is a law, and if it is enforced at the present time, we are going to have some very difficult situations and I do sincerely hope that the State Fire Marshall will have as much zeal towards trying to correct situations and make them correct as he did in making the defeat of LB 199. I certainly hope that he is a man about this and that he will do his best to provide for the people of the state of Nebraska those things which they need. This legislature and myself included want to do everything we can to protect all of the people of the state of Nebraska, including prisoners in jails, but there has to be somewhere along the line, just a little bit of discretion, in these things and where these life safety codes should be rules and regulations as provided, it should not be in the statute. Now again Senator Kremer I am not having any criticism whatsoever of the committee because I know that the State Fire Marshall relegated over the state of Nebraska, tremendous dislike for this bill. They brought people in here from all over the state of Nebraska, which they have a perfect right to do, I'm sure, but when they made the statement that the elimination of life safety code 101 from the statutes would eliminate life safety code 101, they are incorrect, because it should be a rule and regulation which has the same force and effect of law, but could be modified to meet a situation, thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Stahmer did you wish to be recognized? For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, members of the body, a point of personal privilege. I just received a letter from the Governor asked to be inserted in the journal, which was granted unanimously, I would just like to point out that I have never had any contact with the Governor concerning the bill under consideration, he does not know my opinions whatsoever, he does not know any basis and facts whatsoever, he is not cared to try to find out whatsoever, and in my estimation he is trying to circumvent the processes of the legislature in which bills are heard and issues are presented by both sides which I think represents the two house system, namely public hearings, and to pass judgement on a bill and saying he will veto it without ever talking to the introducer and trying to find out what the reasons are behind the introduction of such a bill to me is astounding to say the least.
