SENATOR WHITNEY: So, Senator Carpenter, I would like to see the amendments in the Journal if this is what it's going to do because as it appears to me that I would have to object unless I saw exactly what the amendments were.

SENATOR CARPENTER: You could vote the amendments out, I don't care what you do. I didn't know you were a bleeding heart.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I don't know what that means.

SENATOR CARPENTER: You don't?

SPEAKER: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President.
