

does seem to the chair that if there are more amendments, we should get them all printed in the Journal and let me ask, are there any other amendments. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: We have no further amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: No further amendments.

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpen...Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Chairman, we have adopted the Kelly amendments.

SPEAKER: Oh yes. Yes, we have done that. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw my amendments, as long as I don't know what I am talking about.

SPEAKER: Is there any objections to that?

SENATOR CARPENTER: (inaudible) maybe I can better understand what I am trying to do and I thank Senator Cavanaugh for his suggestion. It isn't often I am in this position. So, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendments and I'll take care of them when the bill gets in a revised form.

SPEAKER: Do you have any objection to that, Senator Simpson? Are there any objections to Senator Carpenter withdrawing his amendments? Seeing none, that is so ordered.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, is it understood the clerk will have somebody revise the bill with the amendments that have been adopted.

SPEAKER: Are there any objections to having the clerk now incorporate the amendments into the bill so that the body can see how the bill reads in its present position with these amendments that have been adopted. Is there any objection to that?

CLERK: This does not include, Mr. President, the Carpenter amendments..

SPEAKER: Does not include the Carpenter amendments. It has been withdrawn. Do I hear any objections to these amendments being incorporated into the bill and placed in the Journal, so that the body can read it and then going from there. That is, to pass further action on the...pass over the bill today. Senator Marsh, do you have objection to that procedure? Hearing no objection, it is so ordered. Now proceed to LB 68. The clerk will read. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I was responsible for bracketing 68 and 68A. I'd like to have them unbracketed. Senator Duis, in so far as we are concerned and I think the Real Estate Commission and others, have no objection to the amendment which is now on the clerk's desk.

SPEAKER: Senator, they are bracketed as I read the worksheet for today. Pardon. Yes, they are automatically unbracketed and we are ready to consider these bills. Mr. Clerk, you haven't read 112 yet.

CLERK: Read title. LB 68. Mr. President, the bill had previously been read on February 23. The thing...the bill was laid over then until today. There are committee amendments which are still pending by Senator Fred Carstens' Banking, Commerce, and Insurance Committee.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk, you are talking about LB 68.

CLERK: Yes.
