SENATOR KIME: Mr. Chairman, this was originally my bill as Senator Clark so stated, and I thought at first it was endorsed by PEA but I found out very soon that it is not endorsed by the REA of Nebraska, Rural Electric people. The rural electric people have their own inspections, they go by the national electric code, if a house or a commercial building, warehouse or anything else is being built, it must be, it must pass it's electrical code before they will hook up. They will not hook their electric power on there unless it meets their electric code. Also there is a provision for the state fire marshall to make inspections any time he wants to or at the request of any single person.
