specifically passed by this Legislature for that purpose. Now according to the estimates I have, these are not original with me to be perfectly fair with you, Senator Lewis. The estimated increase in the cost to the electrical division would be approximately \$5,000 to cover the additional costs of traveling expense to make these inspections and I would suggest to you that probably the intention of the bill again is not to go into each of these areas and inspect every individual home. The idea is, of course, is that you're doing the inspection, particularly in those areas where you're involving large numbers of people, either where they congregate or where they live in so the estimate I have is about \$5,000.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Could I continue sir? Well, this \$182,000 that you mention, was this generated by the fees from the original licensing?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes, it is and according to the information I have received, there has been an adjustment made in the fee collected to bring that fund in line with the necessary expenditures. That was done last session, I think.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes, I think last session this body did lower the fee. Now as I recall, the municipalities, if they were to furnish this board with proof that they had a code that they were abiding by, then they, one-half of the fees would be returned to them, is this substantially true?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes, it is and I have a list of those cities and the amount of money that was returned.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: And you still have, even after the monies have been returned, you still have a fund of \$182,000?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes sir, that's correct. Which means we'll be able to do this for a long time, Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Thank you.
