and up to the end of our fiscal year, which would be June 30, 1974, so we have all that money, and that's the only time we are going to have that big a span of time in which money will come in, the rest of the time it's one year period, and I use mental retardation as an example, and we're talking, we're not even arguing about the Governor's recommendation vs what the mental retardation wants, because there is a million about a million and a half difference there, we're arguing about the matching money that evidently is going to be lost from the Federal Government for the community mental retardation programs.

SENATOR CARSTENS: In other words, I want to understand this correctly, if we know sin ourselves to sleep for awhile and use the revenue sharing funds to stave off these other horrible alternatives, doing away with the program or raising the taxes, the inevitable day will come about 1976 when we're going to be, or 1977 I believe, when the revenue sharing expires and probably won't be renewed and then we'll have to, become accustomed to this standard of living, but no money except, no alternative except tax raise.
