SENATOR RASMUSSEN: There was no opposition to this at the hearing.

SENATOR SYAS: Well I doubt if the average person like (inaudible) know it's even in here. I know even probably the people I work with that benefit by these long holidays don't even, they don't know such a bill is here, of course, I'm not defending them, because they should get copies of the bills and know it. But I doubt if people even knew, know it's in here, I doubt that other than, other than the Veterans and a few of us, the state Senate here, really are aware of that there is such a bill, because when this bill was passed originally, it was passed with the idea that they have the long week end, and industry at that time backed the long week end, now you're saying the industry they don't, and to the employees and all that, that they no longer get the long week ends. The only reason I'm bringing this up is -

SPEAKER: Senator Syas, you asked to ask a question, you haven't put in any action, -

SENATOR SYAS: I asked him the question why he didn't do it to the other, to abolish the Mondays altogether.

SPEAKER: I think he answered it, if you want to put the motion in to amend this and add the other two, well then we will be happy to let you talk, otherwise, I think I'll have to rule you out of order now.

SENATOR SYAS: Alright I will not put in a motion, I think you, this, something, I'll sit down because it should have been debated on general file, which I understand it was not, and so I've got my piece of the action, thank you.

SPEAKER: Thank you.

SENATOR SYAS: I'm against the bill.

SPEAKER: Alright, Senator Cavanaugh what will we do with the bill?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President I move that LB 34 as amended be advanced to E&R for engrossment.

SPEAKER: The motion to advance, is there any discussion, if not all those in favor say aye, opposed say nay. It is advanced. 3 to 2. That's all the bills on select file. Have any motions for reconsideration?

CLERK: Mr. President I move for the introduction of the attached bill, signed Senator Kennedy. The bill is signed by the Health and Welfare Committee. (read).

SPEAKER: Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I, as the committee Chairman apologize to a certain extent that we have had about six of these bills that we tried to prepare and coordinate and get together to put out, and some of them have been related to our interim study. I hope without a question that we will be able to introduce these bills as they are prepared and brought in. This particular bill all it does is help us in clearing the language so we can have a division in the welfare between the service and the income, and this would give the people in the outstate area an opportunity to coordinate several counties together. I would ask that this bill be introduced at this time.
