SENATOR MURPHY: Yes.

SPEAKER: Is that what you desire to do?

SENATOR MURPHY: That would be fine.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk do you understand that? Is there any objection to that procedure? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, except I want to amend his amendment.

SPEAKER: Alright, the form of the amendment now is, if there is no objections, that the complaint must be filed within three days, from the commission of the act, rather than twenty four hours, now does anybody have any objection to Senator Murphy doing that, rather than go through the motions of amending an amendment. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move to amend his three days to ten days. I think we have to be reasonable on both sides of the question, and I think ten days should be in most cases it would be sufficient time in order to do what the bill says you must do.

SPEAKER: Now we have an amendment to the amendment, and the Senator Murphy's amendment is the complaint must be filed in three days, Senator Carpenter has moved to amend that to ten days, and we are now talking on Senator Carpenter's amendment to Senator Murphy's amendment. Senator Cavanaugh, did you desire the floor? Is there anybody who wants, is there any further discussion on this amendment to the amendment? Alright all those in favor of the Carpenter amendment to the Murphy amendment, say aye, all those opposed no. The ayes have it, and the amendment is adopted, now we are back to Senator Murphy's amendment which is ten days, is there any further discussion on that? Are you ready for the question? The question is shall the Murphy amendment as amended be adopted, all those in favor say aye, those opposed no. The amendment is adopted. Now are there any further amendments?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Alright Senator Marsh what will you do with the bill?

SENATOR MARSH: I move this be moved from general file to E&R initial.

SPEAKER: The motion has been made to advance the bill as amended, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Could Senator Marsh explain to us exactly how this is going to change what we now have, and the reason why we need this bill?

SPEAKER: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I'll be glad to try. This amendment puts some working teeth into the open occupancy law which was left out when this originally was adopted. The teeth are in the other section, it was not in this open occupancy section, public accomodations section only. It is already in the other sections of the bill.
